Looking back, it was the most emotionally and physically difficult, yet eye-opening experience I have ever had. Even though my position was at the bottom of the hierarchy, and I was in charge of all the dirty work, yet I was the closest staff member to the patients. My job was not only to take care of their most basic needs but also to alleviate the pains of those who found themselves in the most critical and humiliating position. I still remember taking care of the patient who was paralyzed waist-down and who couldn't assist himself. I was extremely moved to see him cry from helplessness and despair. For him and for others, young and old who were clinging to life, I have always tried to find a smile and words of encouragement and hope.

The unusual and enriching experience I had at the hospital, equipped me, at a relatively early age, with an opportunity to overcome the fear of death, to grow and to mature, to develop compassion and to realize that life is all we have got to accomplish our dreams.
